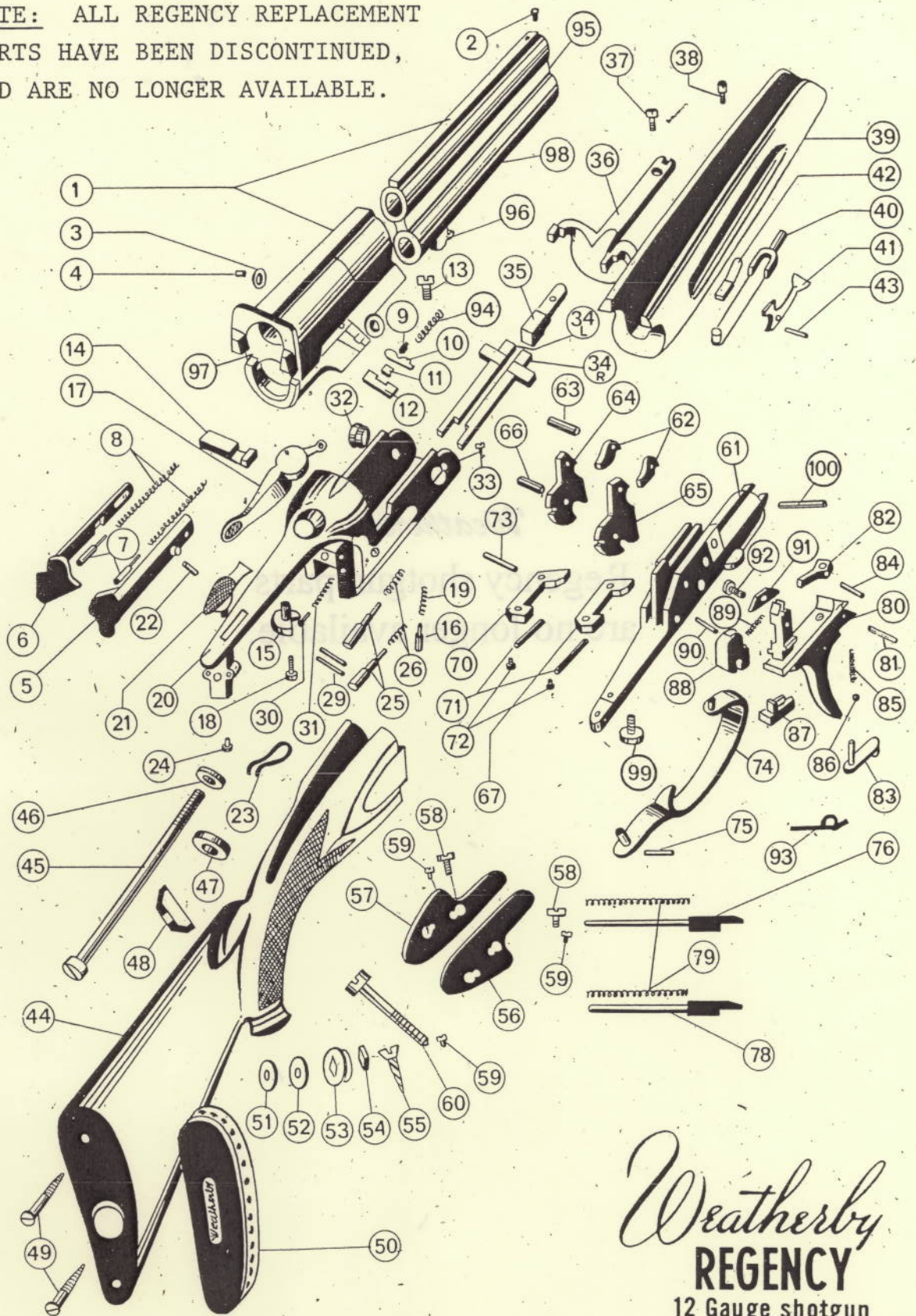

DIRECTIONS FOR ASSEMBLY

1. Disconnect the fore-end from the barrels by pulling the gold fore-end snap lever (photo # 1). This will unlock the fore-end and it can then be pulled from the barrels.

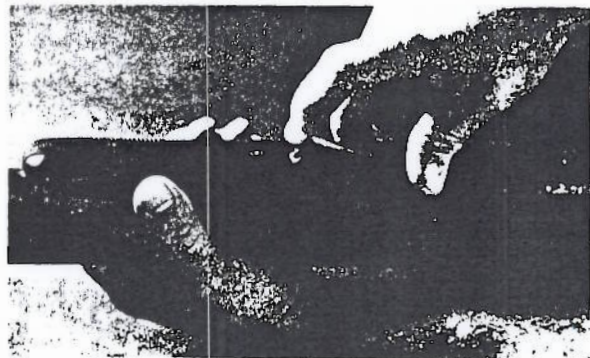

2. Attach the barrels to the receiver (photo #2). Hold barrels in one hand at approximately the balance point and hold the butt stock section in the other hand at the pistol grip. The barrels should be at about a 45° angle to the receiver before you attempt to attach them. Align the barrels to the receiver so that the barrel section can be placed into the receiver. Seat the barrels in the receiver and then pull forward on the barrel section until the polished hinge pin surfaces on the barrels lock into the circular recesses in the front section of

each side of the receiver. When the barrels are properly positioned within the receiver no further forward movement will be possible. Now push the top lever to its extreme right-hand position and close the gun completely. The barrels are now firmly locked to the receiver section of the gun.

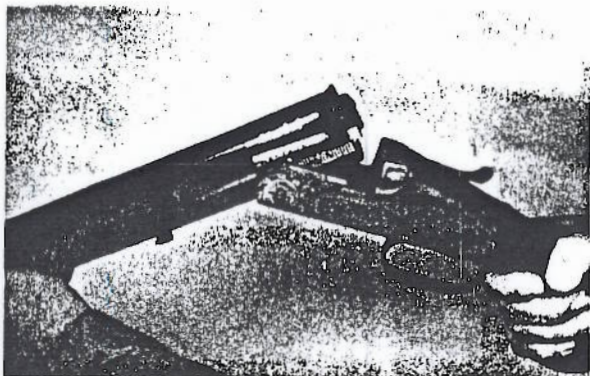

3. The fore-end can now be affixed to the barrel section by aligning the rear of the fore-end with the front of the receiver holding the fore-end at a 45° angle to the barrels (photo #3). Make sure that the rear of the fore-end is seated snugly against and mated to the front of the receiver. Properly positioned you can now rotate the fore-end to its locked position on the barrel section. While closing the fore-end to the barrels, the snap lever will automatically open and then partially close. Now lock fore-end into position by pressing down on snap lever.

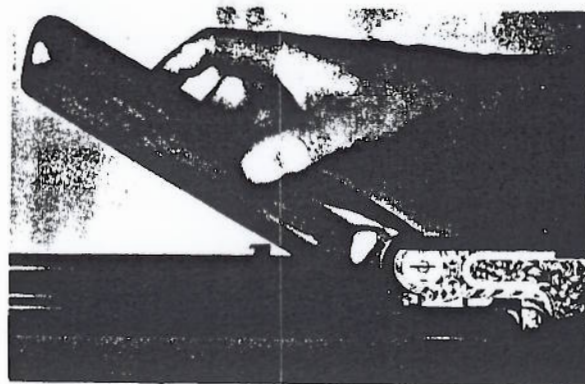

CAUTION:

In assembling your Weatherby Regency do not use undue force. All parts have been meticulously hand-fitted and force only indicates that the barrels and receiver or forearm have not been properly aligned. Undue force will tend to mar these highly polished and hand-fitted surfaces.

DIRECTIONS FOR DISASSEMBLY

1. To disassemble your Regency, first disconnect the fore-end from the barrels by pulling the gold fore-end snap lever. This will unlock the fore-end and it can then be removed from the barrels.

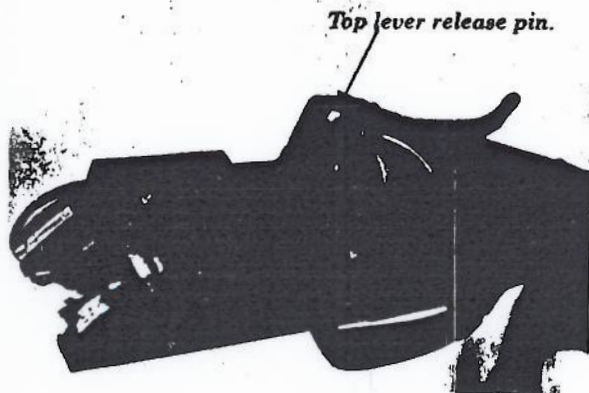
2. Holding the barrel section in one hand and the stock in the other, push the top lever to its extreme right-hand position.

3. Open the barrel section as if to load the gun. Continue the downward movement of the barrel section as far as possible. Now move the barrel section back and up. Complete disengagement will occur.

4. Reaffix the fore-end to the barrel section of the gun by placing the rear of the fore-end in its appropriate breech recess. Press the fore-end onto the barrels until properly seated. Again, the fore-end snap lever will automatically open and partially close. When the fore-end is firmly seated in position, the snap lever can be pushed closed to firmly secure the fore-end to the barrels.

If you wish to store your shotgun disassembled for an indefinite period of time, you should restore

the top lever to its centered position. This can be done by depressing the top lever release pin located on the face of the breech (photo #4). Depressing this pin will automatically re-center the top lever. If your gun is new and the action stiff, it may be necessary, after depressing the pin, to gently move the top lever to its centered position.

CAUTION:

Do not disassemble your Regency beyond separating the forearm and barrels; it is not required for normal maintenance and might cause permanent damage. If the inner mechanism of your gun requires attention, write to our Service Department, Weatherby, Inc., 2781 E. Firestone Blvd., South Gate, California 90280.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

TOP LEVER

The top lever locks the breech end of the barrel to the receiver. To open the gun, move the top lever to its extreme right-hand position (photo #5). This will unlock the barrels from the receiver enabling you to open the gun. The top lever will remain in its right-hand position until the gun is closed. When closing the gun, the top lever will automatically return to its original centered position and the gun is cocked and ready to fire.

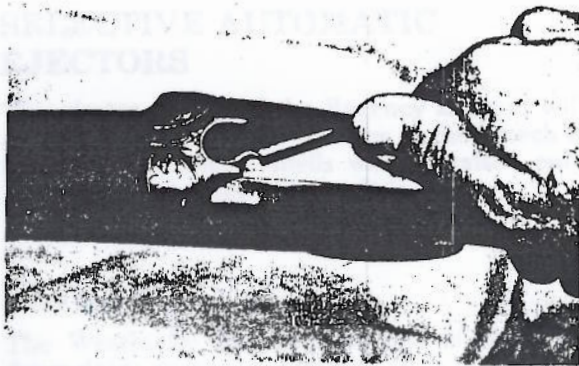

When the gun is new, the action may be stiff and the top lever may not return to the exact center. This will not adversely affect the use of the gun nor will it be unsafe. If you wish, you may gently move the top lever to the left to center it. This is not necessary, however.

SINGLE SELECTIVE TRIGGER

On the Regency shotgun the selective trigger lever is conveniently located inside the trigger guard, immediately in front of the trigger (photo #6). When pushed to the left, the lower barrel will fire first and when to the right, the upper barrel will fire first. The second barrel will fire automatically on a subsequent trigger pull.

Due to the patented mechanical inertia block system, even in the case of a misfire in the first barrel, the second barrel will automatically fire upon the next trigger pull.

CAUTION!

Please make sure that the selective trigger lever is always as far to the right or left as possible for proper operation.

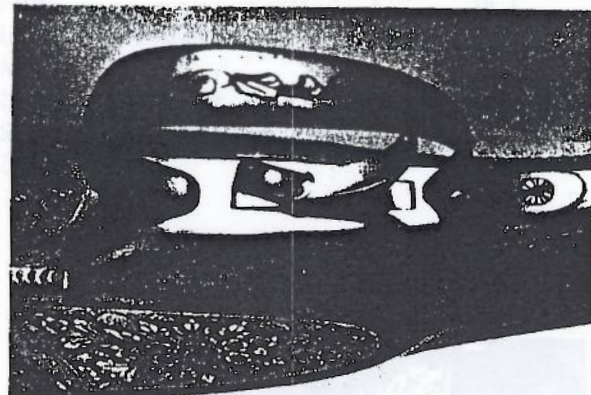

SAFETY

The Regency slide type safety is located on the upper receiver tang, behind the top lever, on top of the pistol grip. The gun is ready to fire when it is in the forward position covering the "S." Conversely in the rearward position, with the "S" exposed, the gun is on safe and inoperable.

SELECTIVE AUTOMATIC EJECTORS

The ejector system of the Regency shotgun will eject only the fired case or cases as the breech is opened. The unfired shells will be raised only slightly for purposes of unloading.

RECEIVER

The Weatherby Regency has one of the most dependable receivers ever built. It is of box lock construction for strength yet sports side lock type plates to enhance the beauty and carry through the fine floral engraving. It excels both in design as well as in strength, featuring high strength steel alloy hinge pivots. The Regency features the classic Greener cross bolt locking system, coil type main springs for greater reliability, and a patented inertia block system which provides for an automatic switchover from the barrel first selected to the second barrel even in the event of a misfire.

BARRELS

The Regency barrels are made of special steel to precise dimensions. They are then hand-fitted to the breech block system and regulated to insure that both pattern correctly. These barrels have a matted ventilated rib and a bead front sight. They are also fitted with selective automatic ejectors and, of course, each one is test-fired at the factory with proof loads to double check for strength and safety.

CHOKES

The choke markings are located on the left side of the barrels near the breech end under the forearm. They are marked as follows:

Full	• or F
Improved Modified	•• or IM
Modified	••• or M
Improved Cylinder	•••• or IC
Skeet Boring	••••• or S
Cylinder	•••••• or C



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AND SUGGESTIONS

CLEANING

Always insure that the bore of your Regency is clean and that all metal surfaces have a light coat of oil. Never pour oil into the receiver. Make sure that the mating surfaces of the breech block and receiver are especially clean and lightly oiled to insure proper fit and locking.

AMMUNITION

The Regency 12 gauge shotgun is chambered to accept all standard factory 12 ga. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Magnum shells. It is not chambered for 3" shells.

The Regency 20 gauge shotgun accepts all standard factory 20 ga. 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and 3" Magnum shells.

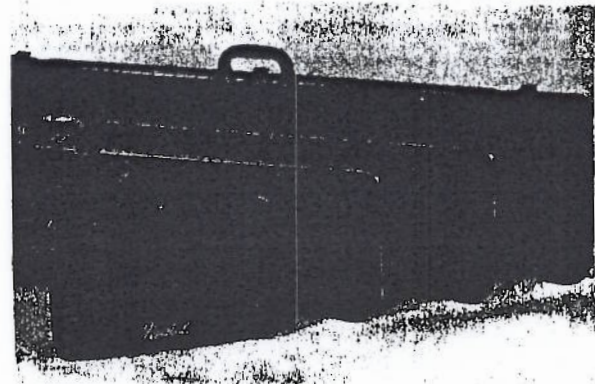
CAUTION:

The accidental chambering and discharge of shells of the wrong gauge can result in damage to your gun. As a precautionary measure, carry only the proper gauge ammunition with you when in the field.

FULL ONE-YEAR WARRANTY

WEATHERBY firearms are warranted by Weatherby, Inc. to be free of defects in materials or workmanship for a period of one year from the date of first purchase by a consumer. For the warranty to become effective, a warranty registration card must be completed and mailed to Weatherby, Inc. within ten days after purchase.

Weatherby, Inc. shall not be responsible for defects resulting from ordinary wear and tear, alterations by unauthorized persons, accident, misuse of incorrect or other than factory loaded ammunition, or failure to provide reasonable and normal maintenance.

Should any defect in original materials or workmanship appear during the warranty period, it will be remedied without charge to the owner, provided the firearm is delivered, transportation prepaid, to Weatherby, Inc. or any of its authorized service centers (names and addresses of which will be supplied by Weatherby, Inc. on request), and is deemed defective upon inspection by its gunsmiths. Firearms must be accompanied by a letter explaining the problem experienced, and should be insured by owner at time of shipment, as Weatherby, Inc. can accept no responsibility for damage or loss in transit. Weatherby, Inc. will pay all necessary transportation and insurance charges for return of the firearm to owner if it is accepted for service under this warranty.

WEATHERBY, INC. SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL OR CONTINGENT DAMAGES.

Some states do not allow the exclusion of incidental or consequential damages, so the above limitation may not apply to you.

This warranty gives you specific legal rights, and you may also have others which vary from state to state. It complies with Federal statutes and regulations effective December 31, 1976, and replaces and supersedes any other warranty which may be packaged with the firearm or which may be contained in any other printed instructional or informational materials.
